After this, they celebrated with feasting and drinking, and they indulged in pagan revelry. ⁷ The Lord told Moses, "Quick! Go down the mountain! Your people whom you brought from the land of Egypt have corrupted themselves.



8 How quickly they have turned away from the way I commanded them to live! They have melted down gold and made a calf, and they have bowed down and sacrificed to it. They are saying, 'These are your gods, O Israel, who brought you out of the land of Egypt." ⁹ Then the Lord said, "I have seen how stubborn and rebellious these people are.



Now leave me alone so my fierce anger can blaze against them, and I will destroy them. Then I will make you, Moses, into a great nation." 11 But Moses tried to pacify the Lord his God...



Exodus 32:14 (NLT) 14 So the Lord changed his mind about the terrible disaster he had threatened to bring on his people.



19 When they came near the camp, Moses saw the calf and the dancing, and he burned with anger. He threw the stone tablets to the ground, smashing them at the foot of the mountain. 20 He took the calf they had made and burned it. Then he ground it into powder, threw it into the water, and forced the people to drink it.




Moses saw that Aaron had let the people get completely out of control, much to the amusement of their enemies.
