ABOUT US

Established in 1986, Faith Community Baptist Church (FCBC) is committed to worshipping and serving God, and spreading the gospel of Jesus Christ in Singapore and beyond. Over the years, FCBC has reached out to the multitudes with services for English, Chinese, Hokkien, Youth, Children, and Filipino congregants. The church has also pioneered ministries to care for specific groups of people, which includes the deaf and persons with physical disabilities.

In the same year of the church's founding, FCBC volunteers started pioneering programmes for children. This work led to the founding of TOUCH Community Services (TOUCH), which is now an independent charity organisation. While independent, TOUCH remains affiliated with FCBC, reflecting our shared mission to bless society.

On the global front, TOUCH International (TI) provides disaster relief and humanitarian support to international communities in Asia. TI started as the global extension of TOUCH's work to transform communities, but has since become a distinct organisation of FCBC.

In the arts and entertainment sector, FCBC champions the promotion of positive values and messages of hope through two direct subsidiaries – Gateway Entertainment (GE), a theatrical production company, and arts venue Gateway Theatre (GT). Separately, Gateway Arts (GA) is an independent Singapore registered charity. Focusing on addressing issues relevant to today's youth, GA is committed to staging performances based on contemporary and meaningful themes featuring young artists.

If I had to summarise 2024 for FCBC, Gateway and TI using one word, it would be “Momentum”.

Across the pages of this report, you will read about how God has given us the momentum to continue creating realities that do not yet exist. And while there is much to be said about the year that was, I would like to focus on what I believe are three characteristics that define the momentum that we’ve experienced.

Firstly, this momentum is defined by the **new frontiers** in our work and ministry. The word “frontier” is often associated with geographic borders, but it also refers to the border between what is known and unknown. As a faith community, the work we do through FCBC, Gateway and TI is a familiar one. But I see how God has given us

new opportunities to break out of the mould and explore new ways to serve our church, transform our community and bless the nations.

The G12 Asia Leadership Summit held in Bangkok last year is testament to that. Our church has been running conferences for many years, but organising one overseas was unprecedented. There were many challenges to overcome, new issues that the team confronted for the first time. But we came together with our friends in Liberty Church (Bangkok), and the Summit turned out to be a wonderful and intimate time spent with the pastors from G12 churches across Asia. Pastor Daniel ably led our church to obey God and follow His call to serve the nations in this extraordinary way. I am proud of him and our entire team.

Secondly, this momentum is one of **renewed passion** for the community that we are in. There are many stories from our church and our work in the nations that testify of this. But over at Gateway Theatre, it is especially heartening to see how our team there has doubled down on its efforts in the past year to feature productions made for the whole family. Since its inception, we envisioned Gateway Theatre to be a place that brings families and the community together. Today, Gateway Theatre is not just a performing arts venue, but also a space for families to spend quality time together, and for important conversations on mental wellness and community change to take place. I am thankful that God has renewed the passion of our GT staff to serve the community through the arts.

Thirdly, this momentum has generated a **new level of faith** in our hearts. Staging Celebration of Life in Osaka was a great exercise of faith for our FCBC and Gateway Entertainment teams. As we began to lay the groundwork for the show, we realised we

had an uphill task to generate interest and garner support. But, I firmly believed that in this season, God gave us an opportunity to bring the Good News to Japan. I'm glad that we persevered. It was a joy to see each show filled with people, many of whom responded to the Gospel for the first time. I am thankful for the privilege to serve the churches in Osaka. But I know God's work in Japan is not done, and I'm excited to see where God leads us next.

The momentum that we've experienced in the past year has positioned us to enter the next season on sure footing. I'm excited for the season of fresh winds. It will be a season for us to dream again. A season of creating realities that do not yet exist, in places that we've never dreamed we'd be in, reaching people we never thought we would meet. I look forward to seeing how God allows this season to unfold not just in our church, but in the arts, and in the nations as well. While the season ahead will not be free of challenges, I know that God is with us on this faith adventure ahead.

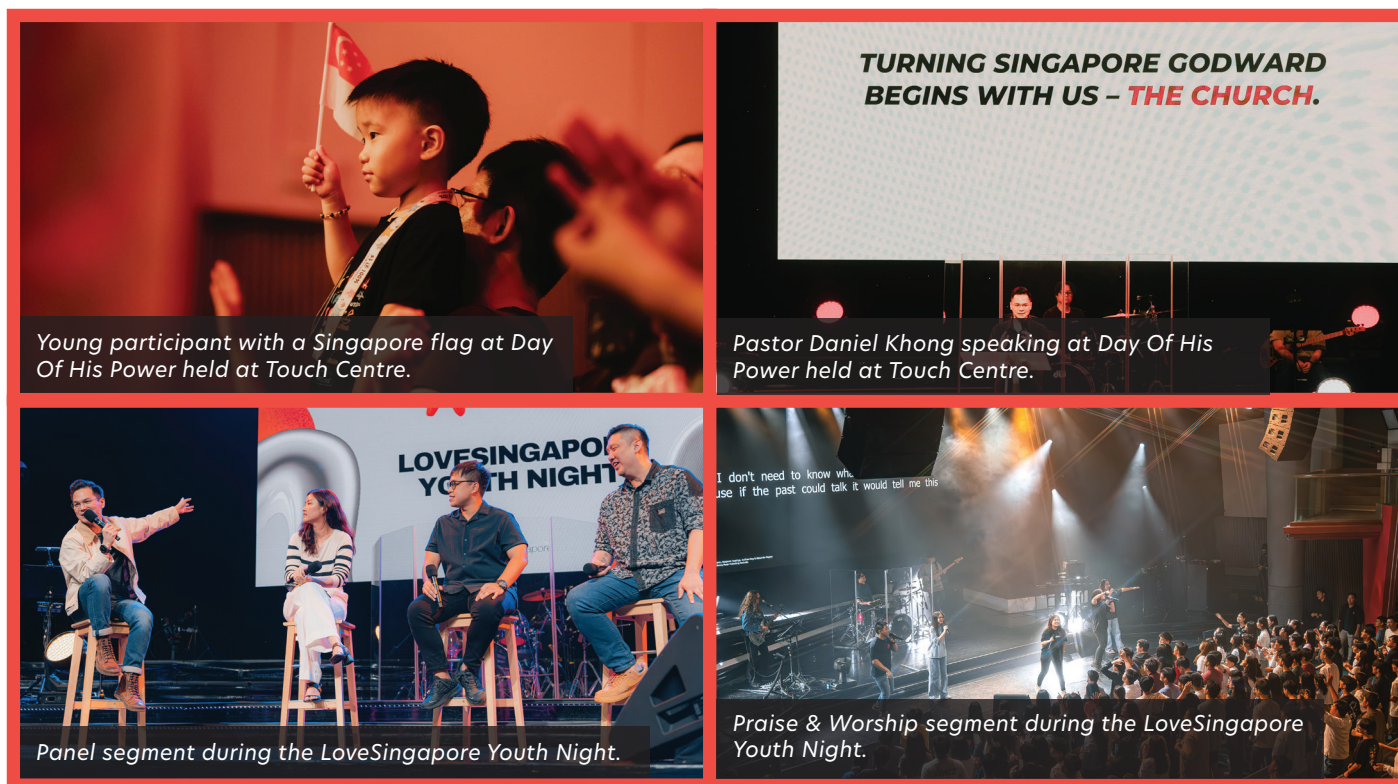

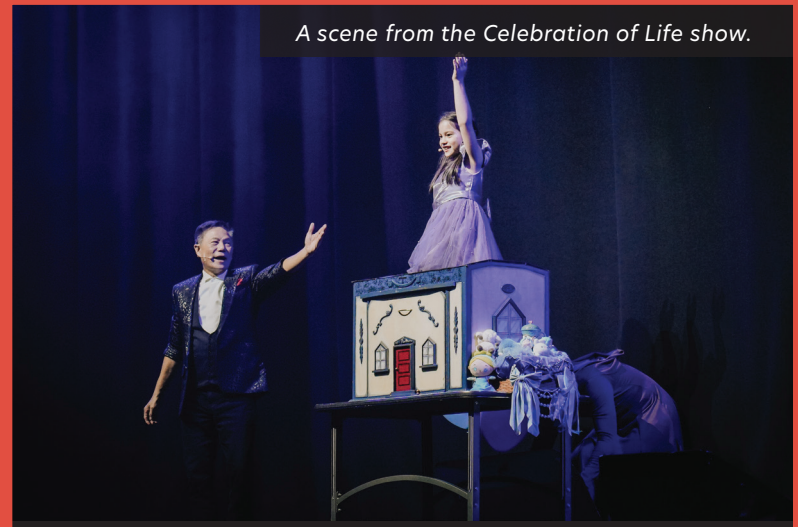

MESSAGE BY PRISCILLA KHONG

2024 has been an eventful year for Gateway. It was a year of faithfully carrying out the work to which we are called to at Gateway, and it was also a year of seeing God's faithfulness as He leads us in this work.

Despite our initial plans for the 2023 staging at Gateway Theatre to be its last, Gateway Entertainment faithfully answered God's call to bring *Celebration of Life* to Japan. The team made multiple trips throughout the year in preparation— some to meet with venue staff and production partners, and many more for our Chairman, Apostle Lawrence Khong, and CEO, Reverend Dr Nina Khong, to meet with pastors around Japan to rally support for the show. Most of these churches had memberships of only a few dozen, yet they trusted God for what seemed to be impossible at that time, and more than 4,000 people attended the five shows in Osaka.



In 2024, Gateway Theatre entered its seventh year as an arts centre for children, youth, and family. This year was also its second year of commissioning shows, with one new English play and two Chinese

plays based on folk tales, catered entirely to young children. The shift to commissioning shows was a bold but important step for Gateway Theatre. While it is costly, it allows us greater control over the types of programmes staged here. The fledgling programming team made the bold decision to increase the total number of public shows, pushing forward with strategic marketing efforts to ensure their success. Their boldness paid off, with total ticket sales for the three plays more than double that of the previous year.

Gateway Theatre also continued its partnership with Gateway Arts, which continued creating programmes that contribute to the diversity and richness of Gateway Theatre's event calendar. They remain an important partner, with their ability to draw in youths and young people with programmes both entertaining and meaningful.



In each capacity, God demonstrated *His* faithfulness in response to *our* faithfulness at every turn. Indeed, when He calls you to a task, He will also provide you with what you need to fulfill it.

Looking forward, Gateway is on the cusp of a new season. In 2024, we were glad to have Gateway Entertainment's long-time producer, Felina Khong, join Gateway Theatre full-time as its General Manager. Under her leadership, the team is pursuing its vision of becoming a leading arts centre with renewed vigor. Gateway Entertainment is also exploring a return to its roots in film after more than two decades of focusing on live productions. In the coming year, Gateway's different entities are striving to make new connections and broaden existing ones with different communities—youth, seniors, and people with disabilities, to name a few—in their own unique way.

On each front, we know that God is, and will be, faithful in leading us and providing for us each step of the way.

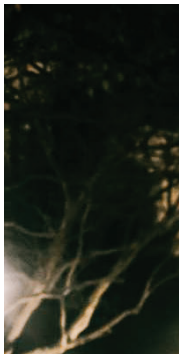

A mission team comprising 11 FCBC members and 2 staff were sent to Osaka, Japan to provide prayer coverage for the Celebration of Life (COL) performances. Staged by Gateway Entertainment from 21 to 25 November, COL brought the gospel to Japan, with a message of faith, hope and love.

Preparation for this mission started in September with team-building sessions and prayer meetings for Japan, setting the foundation for unity and spiritual readiness.

On-site in Osaka, their days were marked by earnest, unceasing prayer. Before each show, they engaged in

prayer walks inside the Cool Japan Park Osaka Hall. As the team prayer walked, they learned to listen and trust in the voice of the Holy Spirit. Many words of knowledge and visions were released for each show to encourage the production crew and inspire the team to press on in prayer.

The most impactful moments were during the altar calls each night, as the prayer team counted the number of hands raised in response to the message of salvation. It was awe-inspiring to see the hundreds of lives touched by God, in response to the incredible performances.

Our GKidz children also took part in the festive celebrations through "Christmas Unboxed".

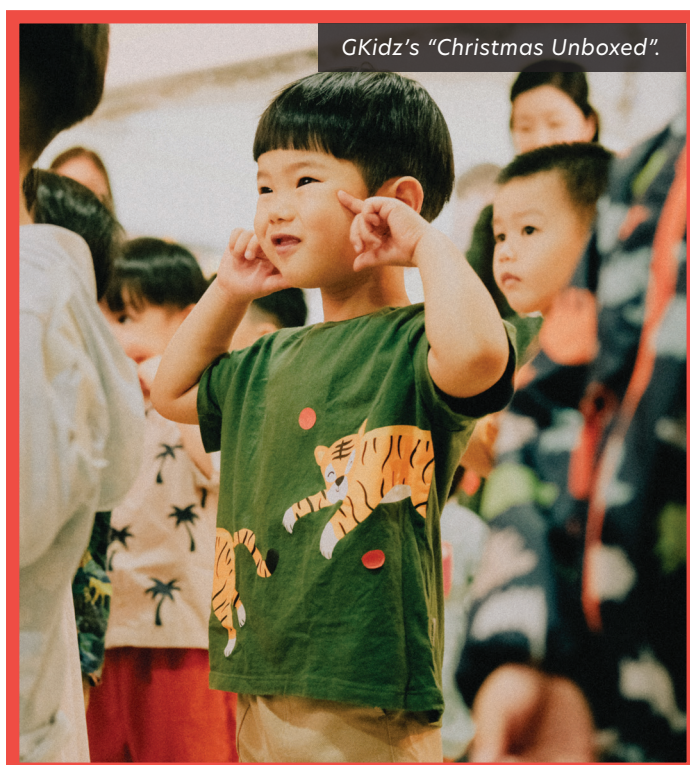
Over 3 weekends in December, primary-aged kids were led to "unbox" different gifts in a variety-show style programme that featured thematic games and activities.

In 2024, we focused on strengthening our churchwide training and discipleship initiatives to better equip our leaders and members.

Our senior leadership led our pastoral team on a review and subsequent revamp of the **Encounter Weekend**. Significant effort was made to ensure that the Encounter Weekend would give new believers a strong start on their journey of faith, with our Senior Pastor personally crafting many of the lessons. This revamp also included our Chinese, GKidz and Youth Weekend Encounters, where our teams worked hard to adapt the lessons and ensure that the whole church moves in the same direction.

The Encounter Weekend format was also revamped to give more time for participants and their guides to interact, which allowed for deeper ministry. Sessions at the Encounter Weekend were conducted

by our Senior Pastor and Team Pastors. Many of the participants were thankful to have an extended time to connect and be ministered to by their guides and pastors.

Each participant was given a new hard-copy Bible, challenged to complete a 3-month mission to inculcate a lifestyle of reading the Word, prayer, and reaching out to pre-believers.

Another area we focused our efforts on in the past year was to strengthen the leadership fundamentals of our cell leaders. Over three Sundays, Senior Pastor Daniel conducted **Cell Leaders' Training** for all G12 and open cell leaders. Leaders were equipped on how to be effective in leading, managing and caring for their members. Time was also taken to articulate key principles on managing difficult situations, and defining the leadership culture of FCBC.

The leadership culture was also unpacked by our Senior Pastor at a weekend retreat for FCBC's youth leaders. There, some 80 leaders had a no-holds barred discussion with Pastor Daniel, where they got to ask burning questions and hear his take on diverse topics. The retreat was also an opportunity for our Youth Ministry staff to connect and minister to the leaders, assuring them that they are not alone in their journey.

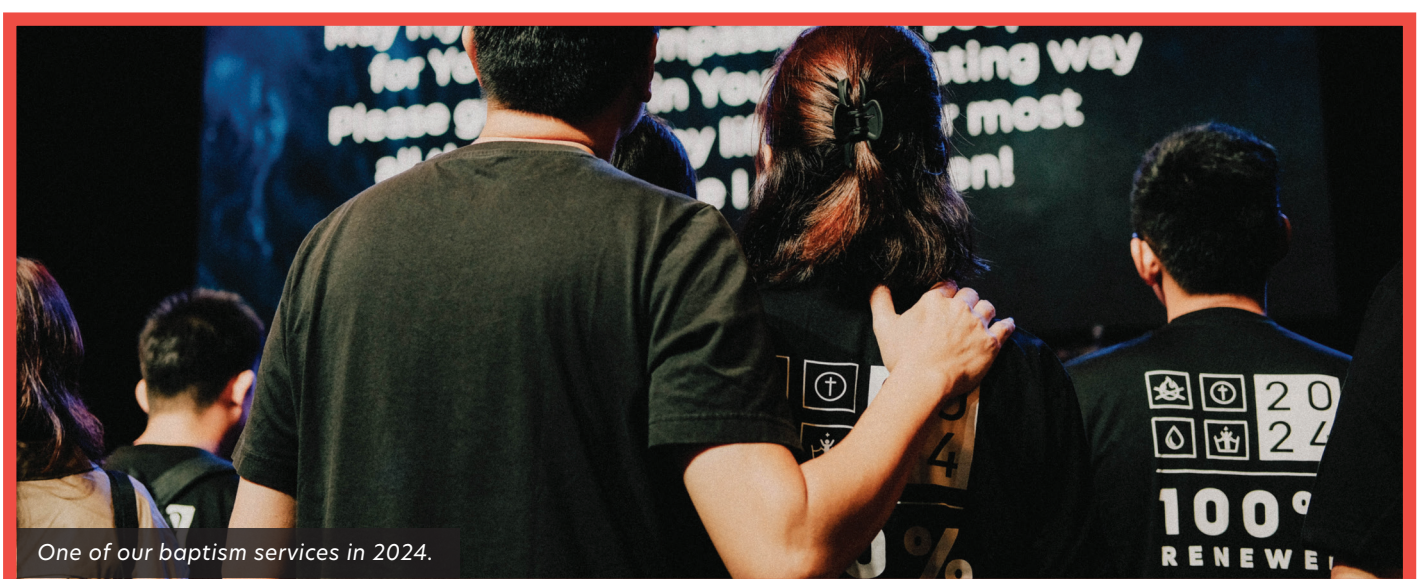

BAPTISMS

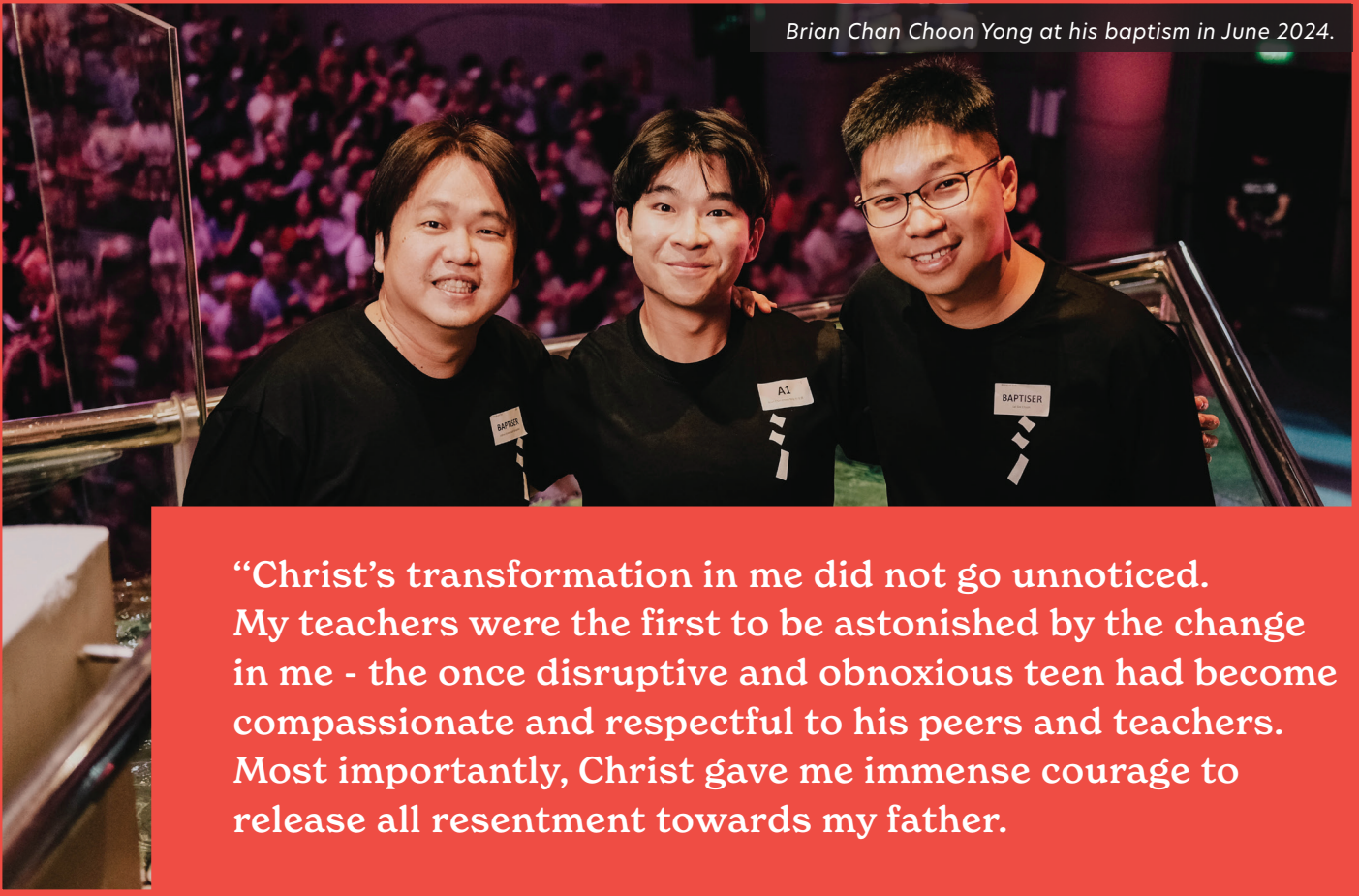

TRAINING

Throughout the year, our Training and Development Ministry conducted a variety of online classes to deepen our members' understanding of the Bible.

To equip new believers with tips on how to read and understand the Word of God, the **Bible Study Made Easy** course taught participants the Observation, Interpretation, Application (OIA) method and shed light on the origins of the Bible, the order of the Old and New Testaments, understanding of the different Bible versions, as well as resources to study the Bible.

The Gospels was a new course introduced to help participants understand the unique perspectives of each Gospel and understand more about Jesus and His redemptive work.

Hearing the Voice of God gave participants knowledge on how they could practise listening to God speak, and recognise the prompting of the Holy Spirit.

The Young Adults and Safe Haven ministries collaborated on a training event to equip 160 participants about God's original design for sex. **Let's Talk About Sex** provided participants with a biblical understanding on sexuality, and practical tips on how to create safe spaces for discussions.

One of the most challenging questions of faith being asked by young adults today is **"Why Does God Allow Evil and Suffering?"** The Young Adults Ministry took the question head on at its YA Night, where a dialogue was facilitated to delve into the theological and philosophical nuances. Some 152 participants were able to have a deeper understanding of Christian theodicy, and received practical strategies on how to faithfully live amid trials.

TRANSITIONS

As a church, we strongly believe in showing strong support to our children and young people as they go through life's transitions. To that end, our GKidz, Youth and Young Adults ministries came together to further improve our transition initiatives, with the aim of strengthening faith and ensuring that no child falls through the cracks.

To welcome GKidz's Primary 6 children into Youth, the Youth Ministry organised **Camp 4:12**. Aimed at helping them better transit in church and in secondary school, the camp enabled the youths to be strengthened in their faith, and be connected to the Youth Ministry and the wider cohort.

Over 3 days and 2 nights, 85 youths learnt about coping with transitions and drawing closer to God through a mix of worship, small group sessions and games.

A key highlight of the camp for the youths was watching “**12 Going On 13**”, a Gateway Arts production that sought to help youths and their parents understand this phase of life and the struggles that they may face, and how to support them.

Separately, about 48 youths who are preparing to enter their young adult years attended the workshop, **Run My Lane**, which was organised to prepare them for life as university students or NSF personnel. There, participants were also equipped to understand their unique “driver behaviours,” and learn skills to more effectively respond to stress and challenges. This workshop also served as a good opportunity for youths and their leaders to be introduced to the Young Adults Ministry.

For youths who are about to enlist, the annual **YA Pre-NS Parent & Child Talk** was a date not be missed. This year, the talk featured Justin Teo, a FCBC cell leader who also previously served as Commanding Officer of Basic Military Training Centre (BMTC) School 2. For the 39 pre-enlistees who attended, they received an understanding on what to expect during their Basic Military Training. The talk also featured testimonies shared by volunteers who recently completed their National Service. They shed light on living out their faith in NS, and equipped the youths with tips on managing difficult situations.

For young adults who are about to start life on campus or in the workforce, the **YA Ready workshops** were where they could receive practical tips to have a good start in their new season

The interactive discussions allowed participants to engage with experienced members from similar industries or faculties, glean wisdom in managing transitions. The event served as a platform to connect, inspire, and empower young adults through godly perspectives and shared experiences.

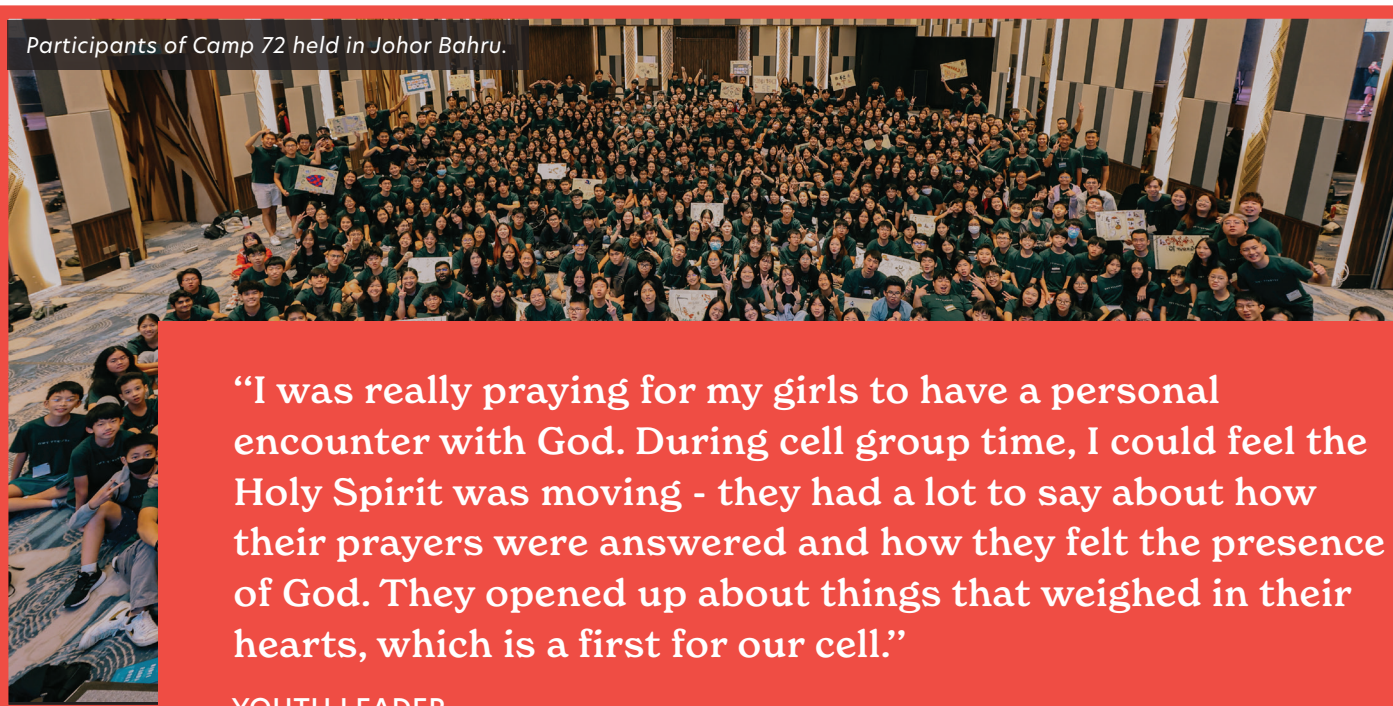

CAMPS

The Deaf Ministry was thrilled to be able to organise a **Family Camp** for the deaf congregation. The camp, which had its last iteration before the Covid-19 pandemic, was an opportunity for members and their families to gather and bond over team-building activities, which included an amazing race! Held over 3 days in Johor Bahru, the camp's 34 participants were encouraged to be assured of God's great love, and challenged to "Love Like Jesus!"

Camp 72 was the theme of the annual Youth Camp, which was held in Johor Bahru as well. Over 3 days, our youths had an amazing time experiencing the presence of God as a community, and were challenged to be like the 72 disciples in the Bible, who were sent out to share the Gospel.

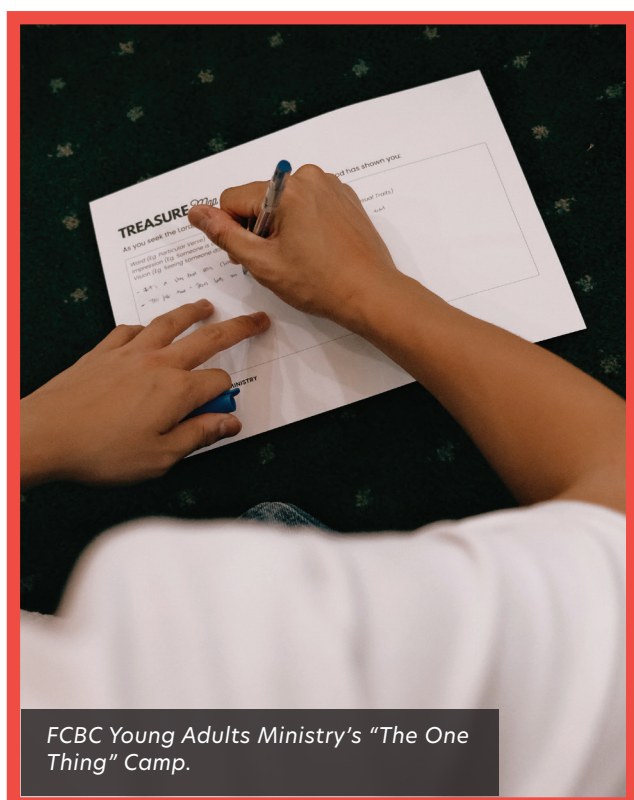
“The One Thing” Camp by our Young Adults Ministry was centred on Philippians 3:13-14, encouraging participants to focus on Christ amidst life’s distractions. Held over 2 days at Touch Centre, the camp also served as a platform to welcome youth who were transitioning into the Young Adults Ministry.

A key highlight of the camp was the “Tent of Meeting,” which offered a dedicated space for students to set aside distractions to encounter God and renew their commitment to make Jesus their central focus.

Another feature of the programme was “Treasure Hunt”, where teams prayed for guidance to seek out “treasures”, i.e. people whom they felt God wanted to touch, which led to divine encounters. Despite occasional rejections, many participants grew in courage and faith, seeing how God could work through them.

BUILDING THE CHURCH IN SINGAPORE

For FCBC, our mission to build the church is not confined to our congregation but is also extended to the wider church in Singapore. One way we fulfil this mandate is through LoveSingapore and its strategic priorities of Turning Singapore Godwards, Winning The Youth, and Blessing The Nations.

In January, 59 of FCBC's pastoral and ministry staff were in Melaka, Malaysia, for the annual **LoveSingapore Pastors' Prayer Summit**. This was the first year since the pandemic where we were able to bring our pastoral and ministry team to foster relationships with other leaders in our nation and to receive God's rhema word for the year ahead.

To rally Christians in Singapore to pray for our nation, FCBC served as one of the host churches for the annual **Day of His Power** prayer gathering in August. Over 10,000 believers from different churches and denominations gathered at Touch Centre and 8 other venues across the nation to pray and lift the name of Jesus over our country.

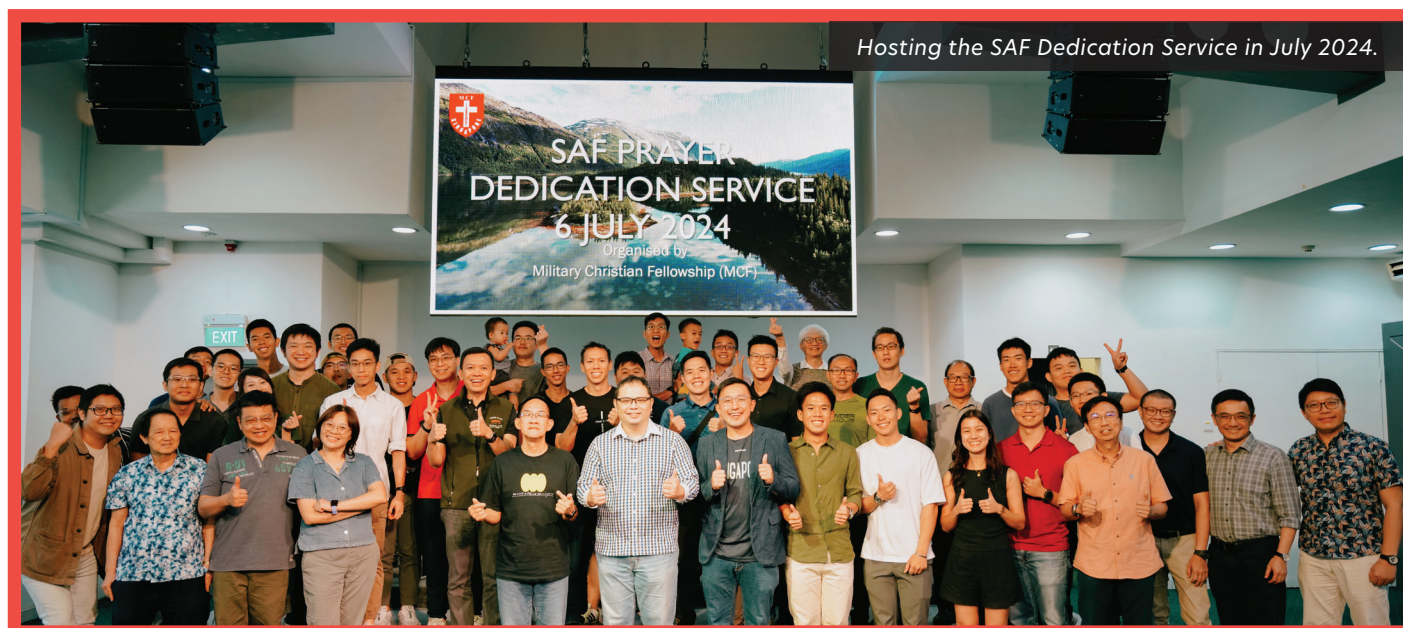
FCBC is also committed to LoveSingapore's strategic priority of **Winning The Youth**. Senior Pastor Daniel Khong currently serves as LoveSingapore's Strategic Co-ordinator for this purpose, and has convened a team of pastors to drive this priority

forward. This team includes our very own Youth Pastor, Pastor Charmaine Cheong, who serves on the sub-committee focused on winning the secondary and post-secondary youths in Singapore. Together, this team has organised a series of meetings among youth ministry workers in 2024 to brainstorm and put together a blueprint for every youth ministry in Singapore to reach and disciple young people.

To celebrate Youth Day, FCBC hosted **LoveSingapore's Youth Night Rally**, which saw over 300 youths and youth leaders gather for a night of prayer, worship and impartation. It was also a time for the pastors in Singapore to encourage and pray over the youths who were present.

SUPPORTING CHRISTIAN SERVICEMEN

FCBC also believes in the work of the **Military Christian Fellowship** (MCF) and its efforts to help strengthen the faith of servicemen and women. The work that MCF does is integral to LoveSingapore's strategic priority of Winning The Youth. Our support this year was through two of MCF's key events. Our Senior Pastor led a team of pastors and church members to attend MCF's **Annual Thanksgiving Dinner**, which brings together current and former servicemen across the Singapore Armed Forces. It was a special evening where Pastor Daniel was able to share a word of encouragement to the attendees. FCBC was also the host church of MCF's **SAF Dedication Service**, which was attended by servicemen and other likeminded believers. The Dedication Service featured speakers from active service, and our own Pastor Roland Lee, who encouraged those present to always pray for our nation and leaders.

Separately, we sought to create a space for full-time national servicemen (NSFs) to connect with other spiritual brothers who are also serving. Organised under the auspices of the Young Adults Ministry, the **NS BBQ Night** was an opportunity for new enlistees and current NSF's to connect over food. We were heartened by the response, with about 40 members and 3 visitors showing up, representing services across the Singapore Armed Forces and the Singapore Police Force. Many of the NSF's who attended had rushed over after booking out of camp. This small beginning served as an encouragement to the staff and cell leaders present to press on in serving this community, and to find future opportunities to bring them together.

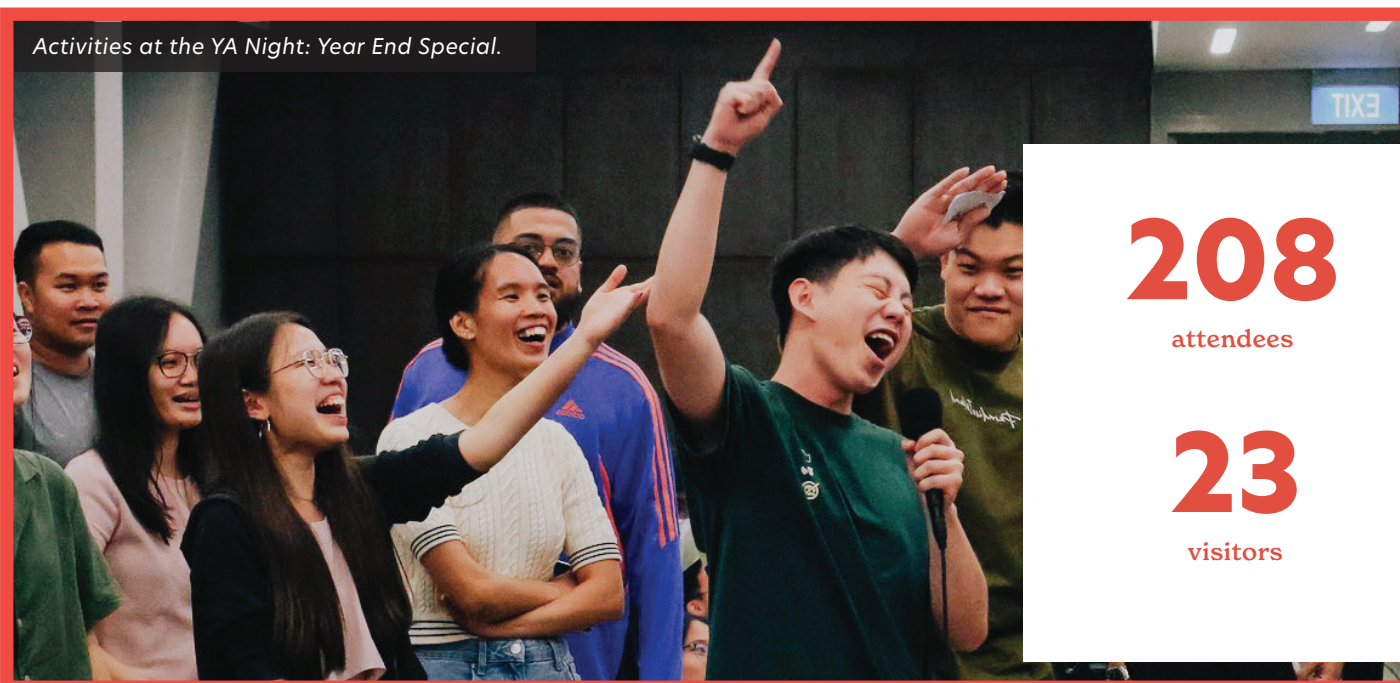
YA NIGHT: YEAR END SPECIAL

The inaugural edition of the **G12 Asia Leadership Summit** was held at Liberty Bangkok Church (LBC) in May. The Summit was an outcome of the Strategic Team Meeting, which was held on the sidelines of the G12 Asia Conference 2023. Then, key pastors from across Asia had shared on the need for a focused training event to deepen their knowledge in the G12 Vision, and to be equipped on how to better implement the Vision in their church.

Attendance at the Summit was limited to pastors and key church leaders from across Asia, who gathered in Bangkok for 5 days of training, impartation, and fellowship. Summit speakers included Pastors Cesar and Emma Claudia Castellanos, Apostle Lawrence Khong, Pastor Daniel Khong, Pastor Bert Pretorius, Pastor Lee Seung Bang and Bishop Oriel Ballano.

The delegates left the Summit refreshed and fired-up to apply the G12 strategies to grow God's kingdom in their respective nations.



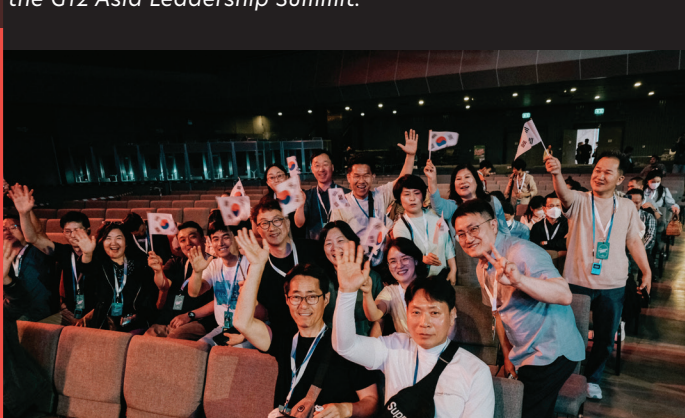

Our Senior Pastor was invited to be speak at **G12 Philippines' Campus Leaders Revolution Conference** in July. With the theme “Catalysing the Harvest”, the conference sought to challenge the Filipino churches to mobilise and press on in bringing the Gospel to the university campuses and to young people. A team of FCBC staff and members who are involved in our campus work also accompanied Pastor Daniel on this trip. They were inspired by the faith of the Filipino churches, and came back home fired up to run their campus outreaches with renewed purpose.

In August, Pastors Lawrence and Nina Khong, Pastor Daniel Khong, and Pastor Patrick Pang, joined Pastor Lee Seung Bang and Pastor Choi Jin Sook at the **G12 Korea Conference**, which was held in Incheon. Attended by over 4,000 participants, this conference was the first national gathering since the Covid-19 pandemic, and was a great opportunity for our pastors to connect with the G12 Korea family.

In addition to speaking at the conference, Pastor Daniel was also invited to preach at 3 Lights Church in the city of Bucheon, where he challenged the church to embrace its core purpose to be fruitful and bear testament of God's promises to others.

Over in Indonesia, Pastors Guanghan and Melissa led a team of 63 members to **Berastagi, Indonesia**. There, they were privileged to serve and connect with Elim Kairos Church, a G12 church led by Pastors Ezra and Janice Kunaraz. The FCBC team was actively involved in 3 outreach nights alongside the Elim Kairos leaders, where they shared the gospel with pre-believers and their families.

The team also supported Elim Kairos' various ministry efforts, which ranged from the airwaves to schools, to within the prison walls. The team also got to pray for Elim Kairos' new school building, which is being constructed with a financial donation from FCBC.

"I went into a prison in Berastagi to help with the baptism of 60 inmates. It was my first visit to a prison, and I saw how the inmates worshipped God passionately, even though they had less. That was a learning point for me as I feel like we need to come back to the basics of worshipping to glorify God."

FCBC TIMOR

In 2024, we sent 8 teams to Timor Leste, involving 30 staff and 9 members. Led by our Senior Pastor, these trips provided an opportunity for our staff and members to catch God's heart for this country, and to think about the ways we can mobilise the wider church to serve this land.

In March, our team conducted a baptism service for 3 FCBC Dili members. The service was held on a beach in Tasi Tolu, a community on Dili's western side, and saw our church community come together with invited guests and family members. After sharing their testimonies, the candidates were baptised by Pastor Daniel and Pastor Sor Kim, to rousing cheers from the witnesses.

FCBC also supported a team from Touch International (TI) who came to Timor Leste in August to explore opportunities for community development in Luro, a region located in the eastern district of Lautem. Members from FCBC Dili currently run a children's club in Luro, with 30 children regularly attending. Discussions were initiated with local officials about the possibility of TI constructing a community facility. These discussions are set to continue in 2025.

A highlight for our church in Dili was the organising of "**Microlet Adventures**", an evangelistic programme to reach out to young adults in the nation's capital. Supported by our team from Singapore, the Timorese leaders led groups to different universities and parks to bless and invite people to their event, which was a race-style competition across 5 locations in Dili. The event drew 18 visitors, who were all led to salvation.

FCBC JAPAN

In May, FCBC Sendai played host to a group of 5 LoveSingapore pastors from 3 churches, who were in the city as part of the LoveJapan Vision Trip. Our Senior Pastor and a combined team from FCBC in Singapore and Sendai brought this group around the city and showed them the opportunities for ministry and outreach.

Pastors Caleb and Christina Chan, along with missionary Charlotte Ying, launched a new initiative in April to reach out to university students through the Meiji Gakuin University (MGU) Ministry. Together with pastors from Hongodai Christ Church (HCC), Charlotte meets with students and preaches during Chapel Hour MGU. This has since led to the launch of a weekly **English Bible study** in September.

Separately, **English Conversation Sessions** were conducted as an outreach programme at our churches in both Sendai and Yokohama. This initiative started online in 2021 and has since been organised on-site. This year, an average of 8 to 12 attendees were at each location twice a month, which led to 4 salvations.

One of the attendees recently graduated and got a job at an English language school after our facilitators helped to prep him for job interviews in English. Ayano is another attendee who works as a concert AV technician. She was introduced to our conversation session a year ago and was baptised in July. She now regularly attends our FCBC Sendai church.

CELEBRATION OF LIFE, OSAKA

Gateway Entertainment (GE), with the strong support of FCBC Japan and FCBC in Singapore, staged the evangelical production, Celebration of Life (COL), in November at Cool Japan Park Osaka's WW Hall. This is the first show that GE has staged in Japan in 18 years, since GE's first magic show, Magic of Love, toured Japan in 2006. During the show's run last year at Gateway Theatre, Apostle Lawrence Khong's heart was stirred to bring the gospel to Japan through COL.

Bringing COL to Japan was a journey that started in 2023, when the show had its last Singapore run at Gateway Theatre. There, Pastor Lawrence felt the strong prompting to use this production to preach the Gospel in Japan. In subsequent months, Pastors Lawrence and Nina made many trips to Japan to connect with pastors and leaders of local churches and Christian organisations to share the show's vision and rally support. The outreach efforts paid off – with thousands packing the show venue, and a teacher from a local Christian school even brought more than 400 of his students!

At the front of house, Pastor Caleb worked with Niimi Sachiko from Word of Life Press Ministries to coordinate the attendance of several church congregations, ticket and merchandise sales, publicity, and the collation of altar call responses. It was truly a team effort to bring the Gospel to Japan.

Buoyed by the response from the Osaka run of COL, the GE team is prayerfully considering where in Japan that God will lead them next to serve and bless the churches.

FCBC supports the **Methodist School of Cambodia (MSC)** through the Missions Faith Pledges. The school is led by our member Timothy Tan, who is working under the covering of the Methodist Missions Society. In 2024, several training programmes were introduced to equip teachers and students. These include digital learning sessions to build staff confidence in using technology for teaching and learning, and industry study trips to help them see how their role as educators help prepare students for the workforce.

New programmes were also introduced for students to gain confidence and competence in numeracy, robotics, and critical thinking skills.

A team of 22 FCBC members also visited MSC in December to assist Timothy and his wife Cindy in the conduct of a service learning project and to organise a Christmas evangelistic programme in the school. Our team worked with students from Grades 5, 6 and 10 to organise the Christmas programme. It was a precious experience for many of the team members,

who saw many younger students respond to the Gospel. The members observed how many students were touched deeply by God and received His healing and love.

Throughout the trip, God protected and strengthened the team and the experience fostered strong unity amongst the members, leaving everyone excited to continue serving God and His kingdom.

SERVING FOREIGN NATIONALS IN SINGAPORE

Some 40 FCBC befrienders serve in the Japanese Home Missions, an outreach ministry to Japanese residing in Singapore. They engage them over various meetups at cafes, in language exchange sessions, and invite them to experience our local culture through various festive celebrations.

One of the highlight events of the year was the Mid-Autumn Festival dinner and walk organised in Chinatown. Our FCBC volunteers hosted 27 Japanese families over dinner and a lantern walk. The event provided opportunities to befriend the Japanese families and open the door to sharing the gospel.

The work of TOUCH Community Services is one that FCBC wholeheartedly supports and cherishes. Over the past year, we have rallied members to contribute their time and effort to volunteer across TOUCH's various services.

In particular, 31 FCBC members volunteered as route marshals at the **TOUCH Family Festival**, which was held in May at Gardens by the Bay. The Festival was organised to raise funds for TOUCH's 279,000 beneficiaries.

Efforts to boost Gateway Theatre's (GT) impact bore significant fruit in 2024. As an arts centre, GT works to fill its calendar with a wide variety of arts programmes to appeal to different audiences. Its diverse clients include concert promoters, dance competition organisers, schools, tertiary institutions, as well as private performing arts schools. GT also partners with other artistic organisations in the community, such as ART:DIS and Collective Perspectives, to showcase artists with disabilities.

Several clients and events also made a return to GT's spaces, including the Singapore Youth Festival Arts Presentation which returned for the 4th consecutive year, and dance events such as the Singapore Challenge Cup, Get the Beat Asia and ODA Student Recital. GT also continued to be a trusted event venue for concert promoters, with notable artists like 10cm, The Maine, Sungha Jung, Blue and Boyzlife making their Singapore stops at the Theatre.

GT also entered its second year of commissioning shows, with three plays for young audiences:

- The Magic Paintbrush, a Chinese play based on the famous folk tale about the importance of generosity and helping those in need
- The Invisible Pangolin, which explored friendships, embracing differences, and giving space to one another
- The Race Around The Moon which dwelt on friendship, sportsmanship and selflessness.

In support of community events, GT partnered The Caregiving Welfare Association for its Caregiving Week celebrations, and Collective Perspectives for DARE Festival which featured world-renowned Singaporean jazz vocalist Jacintha, local pop sensation shazza, and other local creatives performing alongside artists with disabilities.

Looking ahead to 2025, the programming strategy will see a shift with fewer commissioned shows and more partnerships to expand GT's engagement and cooperation with the wider arts industry. The 2025 calendar also looks to be even more exciting, with more concerts, dance performances, and plays for audiences of all ages.
